### Let's Go Canoeing

March is here; newness is in the air, Lent is in full swing and my wife and I will soon be getting out the canoe and be enjoying God together in the great outdoors. And I'm asking the church if you folks would like to come along.

Our district superintendent Jim Barnett has asked the churches to read a book called "Canoeing the Mountains" by Tod Bolsinger. It's about making the church bigger and better. Amazon has used ones for less than ten dollars; a good price for a good book.

It talks about how when Lewis and Clark led the Corps of Discovery and ran into the Rocky Mountains. Did they stop and go home or press on? Press on is the answer. And that is where we are at in the Trinity Churches. We are facing our Rocky Mountains. We've come to a standstill. We know that the churches are not what they were when we were kids, but we don't know what to do. This book can help us in this task.

To see growth in our churches, the churches must grow in the community. Have our churches stopped growing in our communities? I don't know; I have only been around about 8 months. Only the people of the community know that, the churched and unchurched alike. The people living here can see what the church is doing. And by that, I mean the people of the church.

Are we still engaging with the people we know? Do we spend time talking to our neighbors face to face? Do we spend time talking to each other over the fence? Go fishing, arrowhead hunting? Do we still get a ballgame going in someone's backyard anymore? Are we taking the time to get involved in our neighbors' lives? Are we introducing ourselves to the new people of the community? Do they know we care? Are we letting them know that God cares? Are we telling them about a better way?

Now I'm not talking about taking your bible and using it as a hitting tool on somebody's head- that never works. I'm asking everyone who reads this newsletter to start to build a relationship with someone new. Get involved with them, show them you care.

Ask them a question "How are you doing today?" "Is there anything I can do to help?" Give them a shoulder to lean on. We are Christians; that is what we do. We help. If we can't help someone, we find someone who can.

We need to let the community know that the churches are alive and well and are ready to help; ready to step in and do our part as a community of believers or just one Christian whichever is needed at that time.

The need is there, and the church is being called. The people are the church.




Infants, Toddlers & Preschoolers (Birth to 5 years)
